Stained Glass Window Animals

What you will need:

Scissors

Glue

Black sugar paper/card

Pencils

Tissue paper (Different colours depending on what animal shapes you are making)

For example: Brown for wings of a bird, or the fur of a vole

White for a head of a seagull

Orange for beak of blackbird etc

What to do:

- 1 Make a template of the animal you are going to create.
- 2 Draw round the template on the black sugar paper.
- 3 Using the scissors, push a hole in the centre of the outline and cut round the shape (an adult may need to help you with the tricky bits).
- 4 Glue round the edges of the outline and lay the torn pieces of tissue paper across the spaces, gradually filling in the areas.
- 5 Turn over on the right side once the glue is dry and hold up to the light to make sure you haven't got any spaces not covered by tissue paper.
- 6 Stick on the window to see the different colours of your animal.
