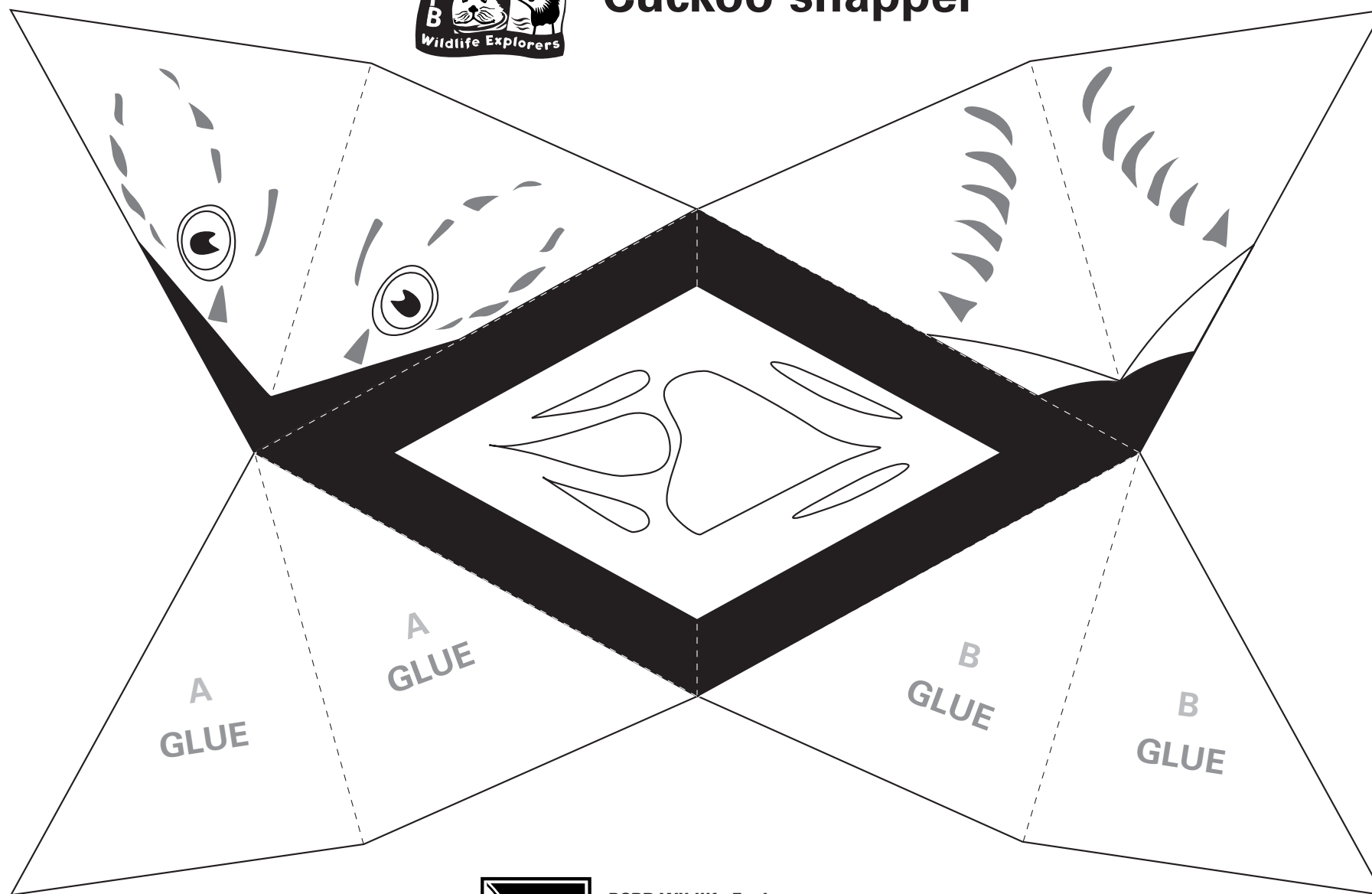




Cuckoo snapper



You will need:

- scissors
- glue
- pink, grey, yellow and red colouring pencils
- double-sided tape.

What to do:

- Colour the outer circle around the eye and the sides on the lower half of the beak yellow. Colour all of the head grey. Make the inside of the mouth pink. Colour the inner circle of the eye red.
- Cut all around the outside of the cuckoo snapper.
- Fold the snapper along the dotted lines with the coloured area facing outwards. Make sure you fold across the middle of the mouth too.
- Apply glue as marked. Match A and B glued sections under the head and beak, squeezing to stick in place.
- Inside the top and bottom halves of the beak where circles are marked, stick a little piece of double-sided tape. Put your fingers on the tape and start snapping!

Cuckoo
Female cuckoos lay their eggs in the nests of other birds. When a nest is not being guarded, the cuckoo flies over to it, steals an egg in her beak, and replaces it with one of her own eggs. She then flies away, eats the stolen egg and leaves her chick to be brought up by the birds that own the nest! .
