

Finding your way around Fen Drayton Lakes



Some of the trails are made of crushed stone, some are grassy. Some follow bridleways, while others have wide kissing gates that pushchairs can go through. They all get muddy in places during winter and they sometimes flood, so don't forget your wellies!

Elney Lake walk

Trees and hedges line this 4.5 km (3 mile) route, which offers great views over the lakes. Stop a while at the hide to watch the birds' antics on Moore Lake.

Ferry Lagoon walk

This 4 km (2.5 mile) route takes you through the changing habitat around our largest lagoon. It's a great way to enjoy and explore the fenland edge and river views.



Whatever the weather, everyone is sure to enjoy a walk around the lakes.

If enjoying a walk with dogs, please keep them on the paths.

In May and June, along the river and drain on the **Ferry Lagoon walk** look for scarce chaser dragonflies.

Join a lake-dipping event and you might find a water scorpion or water stick insect.

On cold blustery spring and summer days, hundreds of swallows, martins and swifts feed over the lakes.

Look for finches and tits from the **Elney Lake walk**, and in summer watch the hedges for warblers.
