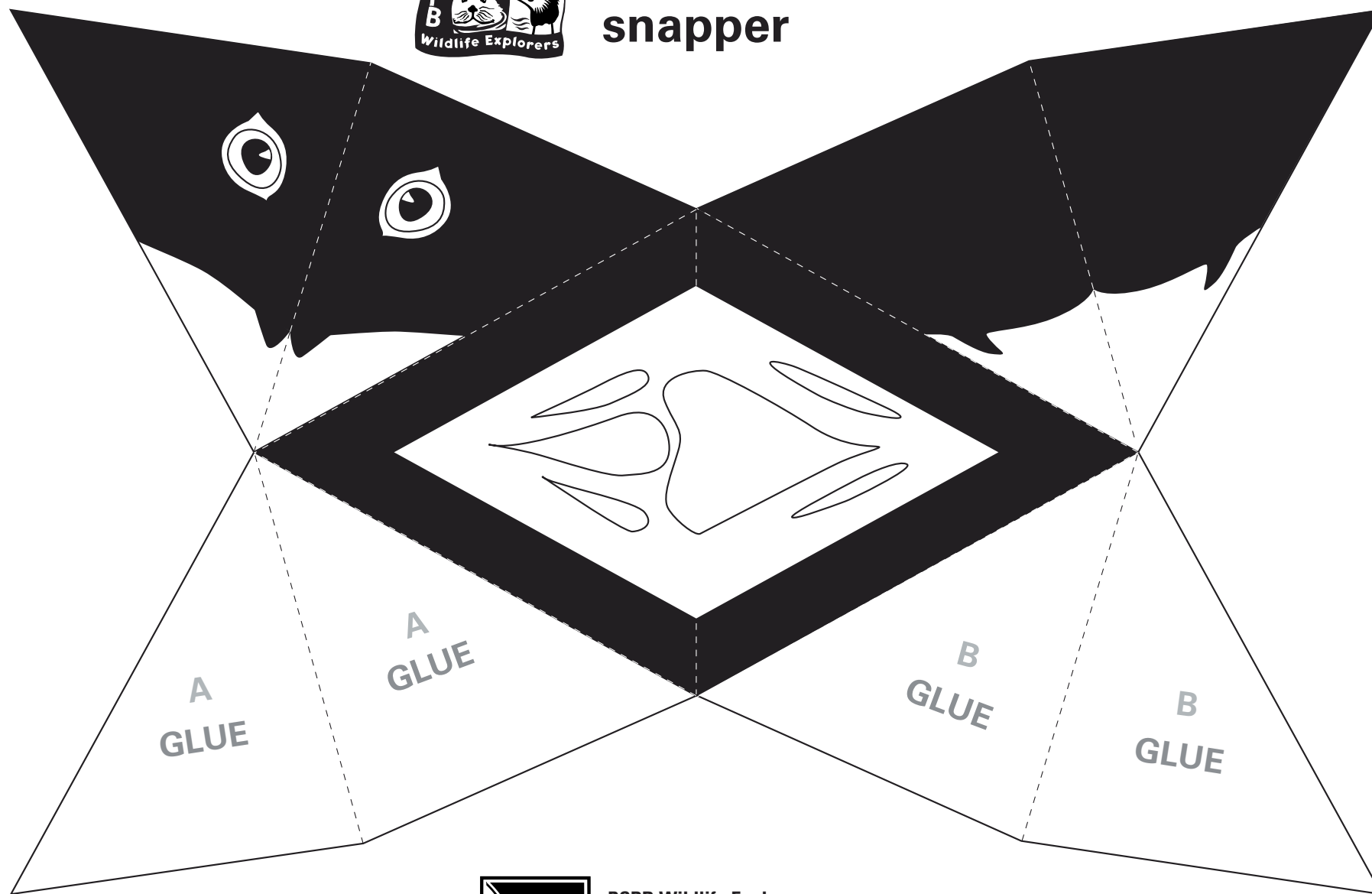




Male blackbird snapper



You will need:

- glue
- yellow, orange and dark brown colouring pencils
- double-sided tape.

What to do:

- Colour both halves of the beak and the outer circle around the eye orange. Make the inside of the mouth yellow. Colour the inside of the eye dark brown.
- Cut out the blackbird snapper.
- Fold the snapper along the dotted lines with the coloured area facing outwards. Make sure you fold across the middle of the mouth too.
- Apply glue as marked. Match A and B glued sections under the head and beak, squeezing to stick in place.
- Inside the beak where circles are marked, stick a piece of double-sided tape. Put your fingers on the tape and start snapping!

Blackbird
Blackbirds are resident birds, which means that they do not leave the UK all year long. Male blackbirds make their own territory which they keep for most of their lives. Between spring and July they nest in this territory, so they stop other male blackbirds from entering it.
