Information for activity leader:

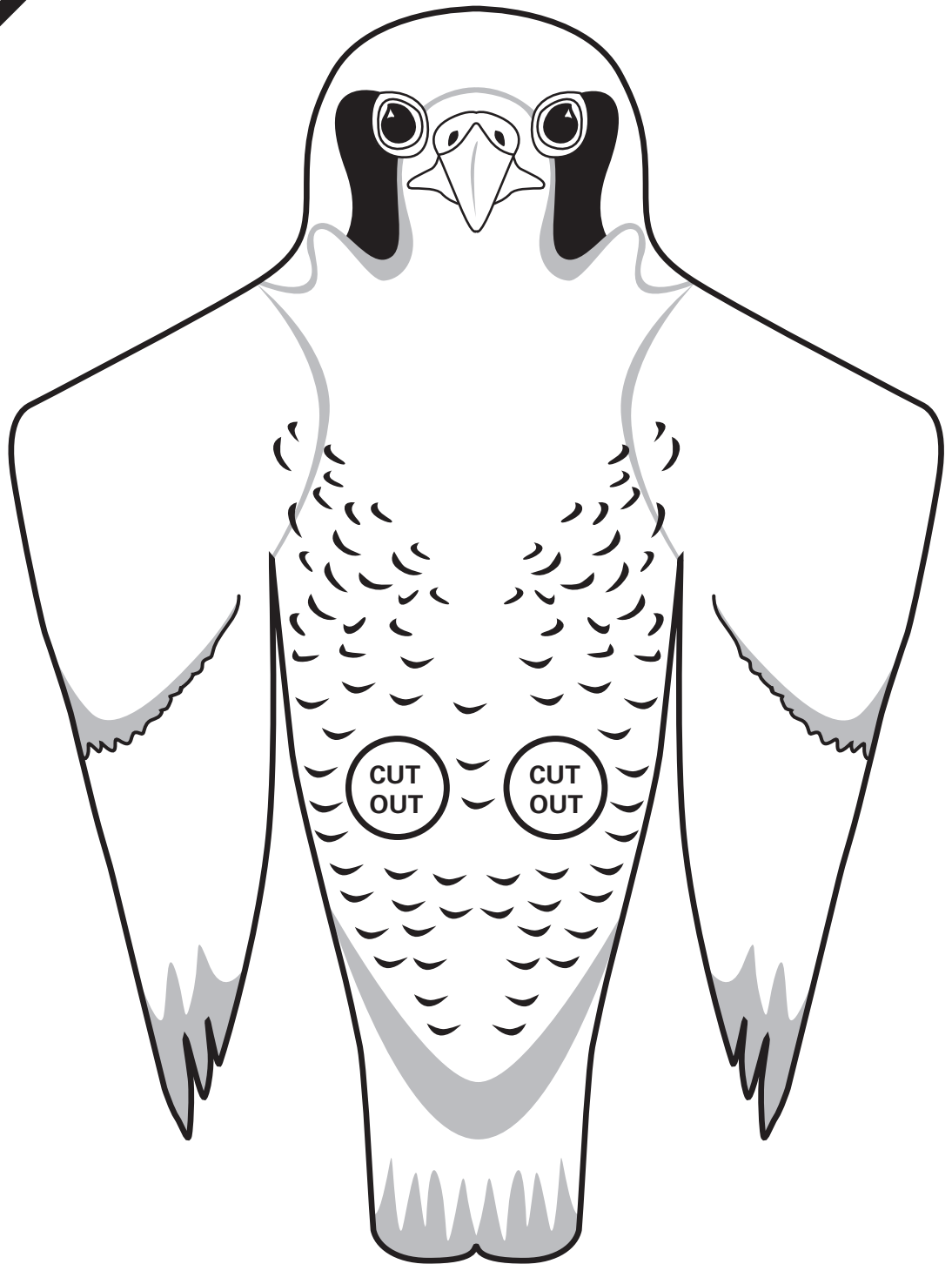
Photocopy this template onto card for the best effect.

You will need:

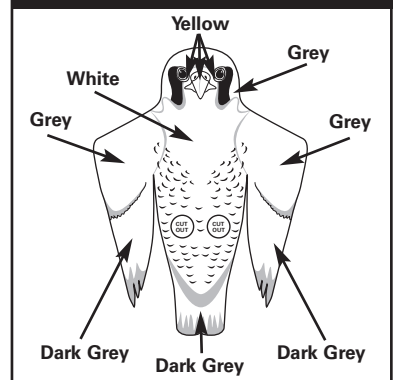
- Scissors
- Colouring pens/pencils

What to do:

- Colour in the peregrine outline using the colouring guide.
- Carefully cut out the peregrine and ask an adult to help you cut out the finger holes
- Put your index and middle finger through the holes, now you can show your friends how a peregrine stoops to catch prey!



Colouring guide



RSPB Wildlife Explorers is the junior membership of the Royal Society for the Protection of Birds.

Peregrines 'stoop' for their prey, diving down suddenly to catch another bird in mid-air. They can reach speeds of over 110 miles per hour, which is a lot faster than the average car on a motorway doing 70 miles per hour!
