

Beckingham Marshes

Finding your way around

Both the trails are just over half a mile (1 km) long, a total of 1 mile (2 km there and back).

They are flat, but rough and unsurfaced. During the winter, they may become muddy and the rest of the year they are often wet so we recommend you wear wellies.

The trails are not suitable for wheelchair users.

Heritage and wildlife trail

Follow the footprint posts to find our Discovery Domes and get an elevated view across the river terraces. The trail takes you to the viewpoint and the walk is about half a mile (1 km). Return by the same route.

Children's activity trail

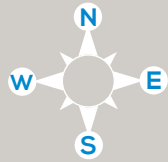
Pick up one of our activity sheets then follow this half mile (1 km) trail to find out more about the wonderful wildlife you can see here.
