

RSPB Church Wood – Accessibility Statement. February 2016

Introduction

Open dawn 'til dusk, 365 days a year. Free entry.

RSPB Church Wood is a beautiful place for a quiet woodland walk. You can take a stroll along dappled paths through beech, ash and oak trees. In springtime you can enjoy a carpet of sweet scented bluebells and there is also a flourishing wild flower meadow.

Church Wood is situated on a hillside. The footpaths are generally gradual slopes with some steeper sections.

There are no toilets, catering, car park or reception staff at Church Wood.

Pre-arrival

The nearest railway station is Gerrards Cross, 3 miles (5 km) away. There is a Taxi rank.

The nearest bus stop is on Stevenson Road, a 10 minute walk from Church Wood. The 583 runs Monday to Saturday. More information can be found at:

By road; Hedgerley Village is 3 miles (5 km) from Junction 2 of the M40.

Car parking facilities and arrival

There is no reserved or blue badge parking for RSPB Church Wood. Please park with consideration in Hedgerley village as space is limited.

From the village walk down the private track (to right of village pond). This is an unpaved lane, with no lighting, that can be muddy when wet (photo 1). Follow this lane for 200 metres. Reserve entrance is on left through kissing gate into the meadow (photo 2).

The entrance into the meadow consists of four steps with a handrail leading to a kissing gate with 90cm clearance (see Photo 2). The leads to an unpaved footpath which slopes up through the meadow (see Photos 3 and 4). The path can be slippery in wet conditions and

muddy after rain. This path leads to another kissing gate giving access to the woods behind the church.

A second entrance can be found further along the track by passing through a gate into a field and then turning left through a second kissing gate (photos 5 and 6).

The field leading to the second entrance can be muddy and will sometimes have a small herd of cattle grazing. The area by the gate can be muddy (see Photo 5) and is uneven due to rubble in the top layer of soil. The kissing gate into Church Wood (photo 6) has 80cm clearance and leads to a path that slopes uphill through the wood (photo 7) and a second

undulating path to the right which leads along the lower boundary of Church Wood and the sign posted circular walk (photo 8).

Nature trails

One marked trail of 1.25 miles (2 km) is on sloping ground accessed by a kissing gate - muddy when wet (see photo 6).

The paths are generally wide enough for two people to walk side by side although there are pinch points by large trees and drainage channels. There are some stony areas but the path is predominantly muddy. Tree roots may also be a trip hazard (photo 9).

Viewing facilities

There are two benches in Church Wood (indicated by the green dots on the map below). One park bench in the middle of the wood and a fixed bench with no arm rests or back support along the north easterly loop of the circular walk.

Nearest toilets with accessible and baby changing facilities are situated with Beaconsfield Service area at Junction 2 of the M40 (2 miles).

Catering

The public house in Hedgerley serves food and drink.

A convenience store is located on Hedgerley Hill, SL2 3RP (not late opening).
