

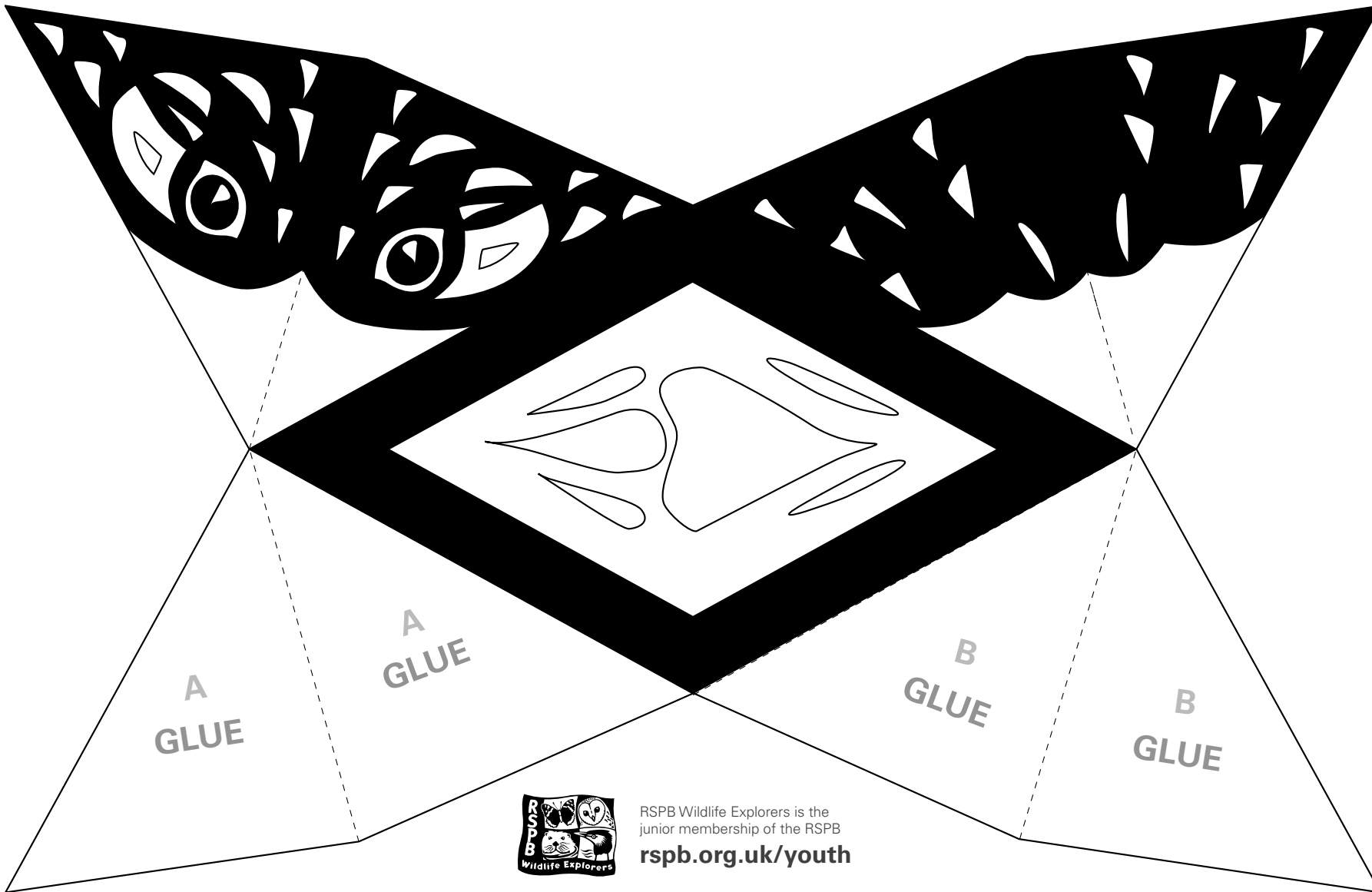
Starling snapper

You will need:

- scissors
- glue
- green, purple, grey, blue and pink colouring pencils
- double-sided tape.

What to do:

- 1** Colour the beak grey. Make the inside of the mouth pink. Colour some of the specks on the snapper green, some purple and leave some white.
- 2** Cut all around the outside of the starling snapper.
- 3** Fold the snapper along the dotted lines with the coloured area facing outwards. Make sure you fold across the middle of the mouth too.
- 4** Apply glue as marked. Match A and B glued sections under the head and beak, squeezing to stick in place.
- 5** Inside the top and bottom halves of the beak where circles are marked, stick a little piece of double-sided tape. Put your fingers on the tape and start snapping!
