

# Welcome to RSPB North Warren nature reserve

The grasslands at North Warren are among the best places in the UK to spot large flocks of ducks and geese in winter – whistling wigeons, tiny teals and several hundred white-fronted geese make this site their home. In spring and autumn look for migrant wading birds on the shallow pools too.














Suffolk’s reedbeds are famous for their nesting bitterns, marsh harriers and bearded tits, but these special places are home to much more besides. Look for wetland flowers such as ragged robin, yellow flag and marsh sowthistle as you stroll around the reedbed loop in the warmer months.

Check the skies above the reeds too. Hobbies hunt for dragonflies throughout the summer and on winter evenings several marsh harriers gather to roost. A large starling flock is often present in winter too.
